....A year of progress and new possibilities

The Christian Science Society of San Juan Capistrano began the year with a visit from **the Board of Directors of The Mother Church** in January. It was two days filled with such love, inspiration and healing, as well as sharing our love for our beloved cause. We all came away with a renewed appreciation for all the Board does, as well as an enlivened sense of our responsibility within the Christian Science movement. That meeting also set the tone for our **metaphysical focus for the year---to nurture and strengthen our practice of spiritual healing.**

Our monthly **Metaphysical Workshops** have included discussions on the public practice, becoming better practitioners, overcoming challenges encountered by our children and youth, handling fear, the importance of gratitude in healing, and a fresh look at The Church Manual as it relates to our healing practice. Wednesday evening meetings have also addressed some of these topics and inspiring testimonies have been shared.

We continue our practice of

monthly tithing to local, national and worldwide activities we support, giving not only financial support but learning from each recipient about challenges we can address through prayer. This year we have embraced relief efforts in Burma, our local CS institutional and media outreach committees, the CS Nursing Care Endowment, Twelveacres, Family Assistance Ministries, CS Troop Support Fund, Petals of Africa School, Boys and Girls Club, and CREER (an Hispanic outreach organization in our community). We’ve enjoyed speakers from the Albert Baker Fund concerning their work in Africa, and from Loving Hugs, a ministry that reaches out to comfort children in war zones and disadvantaged communities worldwide, along with reports updating us on Schools of the

Heart in the Congo, CREER, and Ngochoni Petals of Africa School. Partnering with the Laguna Niguel church we sponsored a musical concert featuring Desiree Goyette which also raised funds for Petals School. Our volunteer tutoring program Apoya, organized by one of our members in cooperation with CREER, continues to support local Hispanic students and their families in achieving success in school. A growing number of our members are active in serving as chaplains and readers in our local jails and have helped support several lectures in our local jail facilities.

In our ongoing desire to embrace those Spanish speaking members of our community, we joined with several CS church in presenting a series of Spanish lectures in Orange County. **Jose Rodriquez Pelaez**, a former Catholic priest and now a CS practitioner and lecturer from Spain shared his incredible story. For the lecture in our church we had conference callers and Skype participants tuning in from over a dozen countries around the world to hear his message. Preceding the lecture we were treated to a performance of our local Hispanic Folklorico Ballet, adding to this truly community event. Throughout the year we have felt the impulse of the Spirit, impelling us and moving us forward, embracing us with the healing presence of the Christ. We are truly grateful for all the good we have experienced and look forward to greeting the new year with an enlivened sense of church and its infinite possibilities.

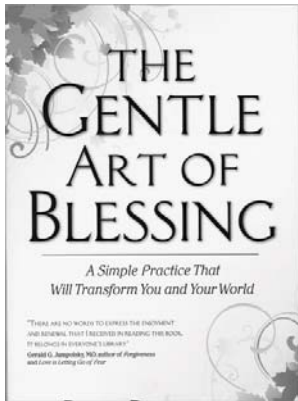

The Book Report...



The Gentle Art of Blessing: A Simple Practice That Will Transform You and Your World by Pierre Pradervand

Pradervand invites the reader on a spiritual journey to become an apprentice (not a professional nor a master) on the path of blessing. It's a humble journey with lessons he continues learning while practicing blessings that rest on spiritual laws. He defines blessing as wishing, from the bottom of your heart in total sincerity, the very best complete fulfillment and deepest happiness for each individual and all situations.

He is a prolific reader who shares quotes from *The Christian Science Monitor*, *The Power of Now* by Eckhart Tolle, and *Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures* by Mary Baker Eddy, to name a few, throughout the book. The author has traveled the world, meeting with everyone from presidents to prostitutes. He says, "During my whole career I

have been committed to the creation of a world with a little more justice and compassion, a world that works for all (including nature)."

The Gentle Art of Blessing first came to me as a list of blessings (excerpted from the book). After reading them I found myself blessing everything. I was calmer, kinder and more awake. Once I had the book I could not put it down until I finished the last page. I have witnessed healing---not healings I was praying for but unexpected healings from blessings. (In his chapter "The Law of Right Return" Pradervand explains this as the law of cause and effect). Practicing "gentle blessings" has given me a better understanding of how to pray for others, how to love, and how to embrace forgiveness.
